Dear Parents,

Greetings from Nova Scotia and the Nova Scotia International Student Program. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for sending your child to Nova Scotia for their education. Certainly, the current situation of COVID-19 is nothing any of us could have predicted so we wanted to reach out and let you know a little more about how we are supporting your children while they finish their year with us.

Our provincial government has closed all public schools until May 1, 2020 and has declared a State of Emergency urging all Nova Scotians to practice "physical distancing" to reduce the spread of COVID-19. As a result, your child has had limitations put on their social and academic lives while we work together to combat this pandemic.

That said, we want you to feel connected to your child and those who support them. Below is a list of suggestions to help you be aware of how your child is progressing and know how to help them if they require additional support:

- We encourage you to have regular contact with your child. We know self-isolation is difficult and not
 part of the experience your child expected when coming to Canada. We encourage parents to talk to
 their children, especially "in person" by phone and by video chat so you can help monitor your
 child's emotional state and mental health and well-being.
- Our Homestay Coordinators are connecting with students and host families to check-in on how
 everyone is doing. If your child needs support, please encourage them to talk with their Homestay
 Coordinators. Their role is to support your child and their host family too.
- Host families are also adjusting their behaviours and schedules to adapt to physical distancing. If
 there is an issue you feel is not appropriate to discuss with the host family, please contact your
 agent.
- Our program believes in a strong and positive relationship with our agents. Your selected agent will
 relay questions and concerns to our staff about your child. Please keep an open line of
 communication with your agent and do not hesitate to request their support. We will do the same
 and will inform them if we have any issues about your child.
- Academically, our schools are now delivering e-learning and learning at home plans. The learning will
 be delivered differently at each grade level. Your child will receive direction from their school on how
 to successfully continue their education. For the students in grade 9 and below this will be learning
 activities and some teacher contact. Your child has this opportunity to continue their schoolwork and
 to continue their connections with their teachers and classmates. Please encourage your child to
 take advantage of this opportunity and be fully engaged in online learning, or other forms of learning
 that will be made available this week.



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- If you have not already asked your child for the parent login information for PowerSchool, our online academic monitoring system, then please ask your child to share this information with you. PowerSchool lists all assignments, quizzes, and tests, and gives your child's marks for each course and assignment.
- Our program is hosting online contests and activities through our NSISP App. We are trying to be
 creative with ways to engage the students using technology so they can remain connected to their
 social networks, continue to practice English, and be engaged in society as much as possible. Please
 encourage your child to use their technology to connect with others.
